It's important to know the value of coins and dollar bills when you spend and earn money.

Coins

Coins are small metal discs that we use as money.

Just because one coin is bigger than another does not mean it is worth more money. A penny is bigger than dime. But a penny is worth less money than a dime.

Dollar bills

Dollar bills are special pieces of paper we use as money. Each type of dollar bill is worth a different amount of money.

All U.S. dollar bills are the same size but they are worth different amount of money.
